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A forty-four year old female Bahraini patient, presented to the surgical clinic complaining of a left groin lump of 10 years duration.

It started with a small papular lesion in the left groin. The lesion gradually increased in size and became bluish-purplish in color. She was treated more than 7 years ago by a dermatologist but the lesion grew bigger.

On examination, there was a 6x3 cm², non-tender but elevated reddish fleshy skin lesion, non-fluctuant, non-compressible or pulsatile. There was no positive cough impulse and no similar lesion anywhere else. See the figure below and answer the following questions.



- **Q1.** What is the differential diagnosis of the lump shown in the figure? Enumerate the differential diagnosis of this case.
- **Q2.** What would it be the best modality of management in such cases?
